





Teaching and Learning

Welcome back. We are pleased to welcome new children into all three classrooms. The planning is displayed outside each of the three Nursery classrooms. This will explain to you what activities we are doing and how this supports your child's learning. We also plan 'adult focused' activities for small groups and individuals to support particular learning outcomes which provides a focus for both adult planned activities and for enhancements to our continuous provision. Practitioners work in partnership with children, skillfully and sensitively interacting to support and develop their learning. We also have copies of the rhyme of the week for you to take home and enjoy with your child.

Nursery 1 and 2 are both exploring growth and change of plants, animals and humans. Children will have the opportunity to plant seeds and consider what conditions they need to be able to flourish and grow. We will be looking at how children themselves have changed since they were born. The role play area will be transformed into a baby clinic which will provide opportunities for weighing, measuring, making appointments and writing for a variety of purposes. Books such as 'Jaspers Beanstalk' and 'Jack and the beanstalk' will help children to appreciate the concept of growth and change.

The vegetable patches will be planted with seeds that will hopefully produce a harvest for children to cook and eat. Each classroom will soon have some tadpoles that children can observe as they make their natural transformation into frogs. Children are encouraged to produce observational drawings as they study the features and reproduce these with their own representations. Once the frogs are fully grown they are safely returned back into their natural habitat. Sunflowers and beans will be planted in the classrooms and these will help develop children's mathematical awareness relating to height, and the comparative language of size.

Nursery 3 is looking at 'our world'. This will cover journeys, maps, globes and road safety. Writing will be encouraged through looking at environmental print displayed on signs, posters, shop fronts and buses. The role play shop will support mathematical enquiry through exploring numbers and prices and talk about shape, space and measure.

A walk into Saltaire will also draw children's attention to the local historic buildings.

Early years pupil premium - do you qualify?

The Early Years Pupil Premium provides up to an extra £302 a year for each child taking up their full hours of funded early education. We can use the extra funding to continue to improve the quality of the early years education we already provide for your child, e.g. for additional staff, resources or training to further our expertise. It is well documented that high quality early education can influence how well a child does at both primary and secondary school so we do want to make the most of this additional funding.

You may be aware if you have older children that a pupil premium has been available for school age children and it has proved to have given a real boost to the children receiving the funding. We want to do the same for our early years children entitled to this funding. Therefore we ask **ALL PARENTS and GUARDIANS** to complete the voluntary registration form and return it to us as soon as possible. This will allow us to claim the additional Early Years Pupil Premium to benefit your child.
