



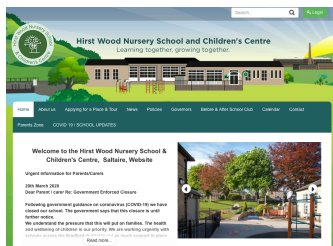
## May Newsletter

### Transition to Primary School

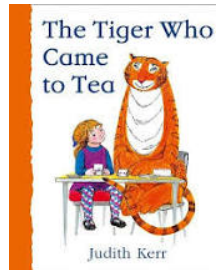

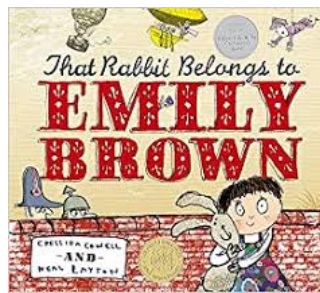
I have been learning to crochet during lockdown and after lots of practise I have made this beautiful blanket.

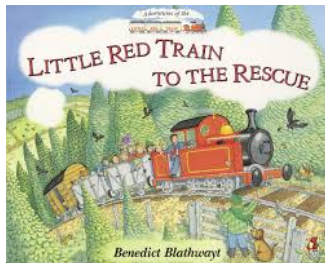
I built a den so that I could camp at home. Lots of people from all over the world camped out too. It was the largest camp ever and broke the World Record!

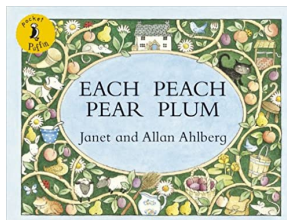
I have revisited a childhood hobby. I have spent some time learning how to sew, using different embroidery stitches, which I have intertwined with my love of nature.
