In Maths we will be:

- Taking part in Christmas dice games where children recognise dice patterns (1–6) and follow simple number instructions as part of a team.
- Playing a "present delivery" game, counting out small amounts of festive objects (baubles, bows, stars) and collecting the right number for their team's Santa sack.
- Exploring festive problem-solving by building snowmen and Christmas structures, choosing pieces carefully and talking about what they need next.
- Practising turn-taking and early number skills through fun Christmas games such as rolling the dice, matching numbers to quantities and cheering each other on.

Learning opportunities:

This week in our enhanced and continuous provision, the children will have opportunities to:

- Explore Christmas wrapping and role play in the home corner, choosing paper, ribbons and labels and practising early mark-making as they write names for gifts.
- Make Santa lists and letters using catalogues, magazines and early writing marks to represent the items they would like.
- Mix seasonal ingredients in Reindeer Soup at the water tray, using natural items such as pinecones and carrots to explore scooping, pouring and imaginative play.
- Follow a simple recipe to make Reindeer Food, scooping and mixing oats and festive "magic" to create their own take-home treat.
- Take part in Christmas parties, helping to prepare the classroom and joining in with party games, songs, stories and festive celebrations.

In Phonics we will be:

RUDOLPHI

- Learning the words and actions to familiar Christmas songs, building confidence to sing them at our party.
- Playing festive listening games, tuning in to different Christmas sounds such as bells, wrapping paper, and soft "snowy" taps.
- Taking turns in simple sound-response games, listening carefully for instructions and copying body percussion sounds linked to Christmas actions (e.g., stamping like reindeer, clapping like elves).
- Enjoying Christmas stories and songs that help develop rhythm, rhyme and repeated phrases, supporting early listening and attention skills.
